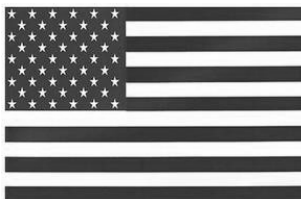

On March 13 Betty COOKE sent a very generous check "to help with the postage, etc., in memory of Glenn." She writes that there are very few names that she recognizes anymore but still enjoys hearing about the group's activities. "I'm blessed with fairly good health and enjoy staying busy." *Why not consider joining us in Oklahoma City this Fall, Betty?*

A February letter from Carl CROW (527) reports a new area code and says: "I want to say how glad we are to get all the news about the group and mostly about the squadron. The sad news gets to me but I'm glad to get it anyway. I know this has been a lot of hard work for you over the years and I salute you for a job well done. Keep 'em flying! I'm 86, kinda wobbly but still on my feet."

An email message from Sue Nelle HURT on receipt of the Newsletter dedicated to her husband Gil "Hollerifur" HURT: "I wanted to call you about the newsletter, but I knew I wouldn't be able to talk. The tears started rolling as soon as I unfolded it. I can't even begin to express what that means to us. I can hardly wait for the children to read it. We both know how much he loved his involvement with you guys and the 86th. It was truly the highlight of his retirement years. And you were able to impart that in your wonderful article. Thanks from the bottom of our hearts!"

While browsing through Bill JAYNE'S Group Headquarters Newsletters, I came across this from his 11/30/88 report: "MRS. PEARL E. BERRY: All who attended the Dayton Group Memorial dedication and the Saratoga Reunion remember this Elegant Lady (89 years young) – mother of the late Capt. George Hill (527th Casualty, Italy). I mailed our July 19th Newsletter to Mrs. Berry and received a reply from her. Here is a little of what she wrote:

***** That beautiful, precious plaque – my friend in the V.A. Hospital here thinks it made me a "Celebrity" but I think it makes me a "Member" of a very Special Group of Great Men and Girls. I used to think that George had something Special to offer his outfit. Now I know his outfit had something Special to offer him – Themselves. ***** It was an unforgettable, great experience to be there for the Memorial and the Reunion."

In a letter from Irl GUARD (see Roster Maintenance), he recalls that one hundred April 1942 graduates of Sheppard Field A.M. School were sent to Santa Monica, CA to study the A-20 manufactured by Douglas Aircraft. In May we were transferred to Will Rogers Field, Oklahoma City, OK as the first additions to the cadre that had formed the 86th in February. He was among those assigned to the 526th (then 310th) Squadron, and Ira is wondering if any of the other six guys with him are still alive and kicking. If any of you are, you can reach him in Santa Cruz, CA at the listed address/phone.

In a conversation with Lyndal and Clarcie HARRIS this month, Lyndal reported he had just finished cutting up the many oak trees knocked down in his yard (Diboll, TX) by Katrina; the largest one was 36 inches across. Clarcie has had several health problems this past year, but is focused on coming to OKCity (their last reunion was Dayton). They will be driving (even made a 250-mile test drive to checkout their stamina), no flying for them.

Sad News Department

BOVA, Marie (527) - Joseph's wife predeceased him on 04/18/87 according to their son, Joseph Jr. Joseph, a Lifetime Member, died 03/07/04 (previously reported).

DORRIS, Harry W. "Doc" (526 Pilot/Squadron C.O.) - Mail was returned by the Post Office as "Undeliverable," and a search of the Social Security Death Index uncovered the fact that he passed away 10/23/05. "Doc" stayed in the service after the war and became an Ace in Korea. He was a Lifetime Member and attended the San Antonio reunion where he treated all present members of the 526th to dinner.

GROSS, Jack B. (Group Executive Officer) - He passed away 03/23/06 at age 94 as printed in the Air Force Magazine (May 2006 issue). Poor health prevented his reunion attendance, but he was a Lifetime Member and generous supporter of our Association. The magazine article contains a picture of Jack and describes him as "one of the (AFAs) most influential early leaders and benefactors."



IMMEKUS, Joseph F. (527 Engineering) - Reports from the V.A. show a deceased date of 02/11/06. Several years ago, Joe was reported by Al BURGOON to be a patient in a treatment center for Alzheimer's disease. He is on our Active roster and has, apparently, been receiving our newsletters. Al discovered that Joe is buried at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio in Section 33 #154 for those wanting to visit.

KASTNER, George W. "Tink" (527 Pilot, Operations Officer) - Passed away on 04/01/06 following a fall. The Association sent flowers to the funeral, attended by an overflow crowd that came to pay their respects to a man who contributed much to the community where he was born and lived his entire life. George and Thelma were stalwarts of the Association almost from the beginning of our existence. Our deepest sympathy goes out to Thelma and the family at this difficult time. Tink was a member of the Board of Directors for several "tours," serving as President on two occasions. An early Lifetime Member, he and Thelma attended 20 reunions, the last in Branson. The 1994 reunion in Fresno was beautifully hosted by them. He and his many-times-told war and other stories will be sorely missed.

Trivia About OKCity You Might Not Know

Oklahoma City lays claim to having the nation's second lowest cost of living among major U.S. cities.

The U.S. Government opened part of OK to white settlement in 1889 which began the OK land rushes. When the territory where OKCity would be built was officially opened, more than 50,000 homesteaders gathered at the boundaries. Some people snuck in during the night before to stake out prime land early, hiding from the army patrols. These were known as "Sooners."

Oklahoma City is one of only two capital cities with their state name as part of the city name. The other is Indianapolis, IN.

Oklahoma City is the second largest city in the nation still in compliance with the Clean Air Act (after Jacksonville, Florida). (A Health Note for reunion attendees!)

At Tinker AFB, the historic Building 3001, where reunion attendees will have a tram tour of the Air Maintenance Facility, covers 62 acres.
